## DAY ONE

June 20, 2012 | Wednesday

### Moscow

Arrival into Moscow and transfer to the exquisite Ritz Carlton Hotel Moscow just steps from Red Square.

This afternoon, after a break to freshen up, your guide will take you on an introductory walk of your hotel's neighborhood and Red Square. Be sure not to miss the newly rebuilt church and Imperial Gates at the south end of Red Square- they were both destroyed under Stalin and only recently have been rebuilt in their original splendor.

Your guide will also show you the stunning St. Basil's Cathedral. This magnificent cathedral was commissioned by Ivan the Terrible and was completed in 1561. Rumor has it that Ivan had the architect blinded so he would never be able to design anything as exquisite again! The cathedral is at its most awesome when viewed from the outside and your guide will be happy to explain its history and the significance of its domes, each of which contains a separate chapel.

You will also have the opportunity to stroll through the neighboring Kitay Gorod district. The very center of Moscow and indeed, of Russia. The neighborhood was a fortress behind a fence ("kitai" meaning "Strong"). This ancient district is the very heart of Moscow's downtown. The many churches that line the streets of this neighborhood are excellent examples of the architectural styles dating back to the 15th and 18th century.

Meet in the lobby of your hotel this evening for your welcome dinner. Dinner includes three courses and unlimited mineral water, tea and coffee.

## DAY TWO

June 21, 2012 | Thursday

Moscow

This morning your guide will take you to see the famous Tretyakov Gallery. The Tretyakov is located in one of Moscow's most interesting neighborhoods, Zamoskvoreche ("beyond the Moscow River"), which was originally settled in the 13th century. The small winding streets give this area an almost old-fashioned atmosphere, with historic churches and the mansions of 19th century wealthy merchants.

The Tretyakov Gallery is situated in the former home of Pavel Tretyakov. Your guide will take you through the museum, which houses only Russian artists - from Andrei Rublev's icons to famous Russian painters of the 20th century.

After your tour of the gallery, your guide has arranged for a visit to the adjoining private chapel of the Tretyakov family, the Church of St. Nicholas. This small, intimate chapel is where the entire family of the wealthy Russian merchant and art collector would attend private services. Here, you will have the chance to see Russia's most venerated icon, The Theotokos of Vladimir. This icon was a gift of the patriarch of Constantinople to the Grand Prince of Russia in 1132.

To the south of the city lie a number of fortified monasteries, built to defend the city against the Mongols. The most spectacular of them is Novodevichy Convent, constructed in the 16th century. This serene sanctuary houses the convent's fascinating cemetery with the graves of many famous Russians, from cultural figures to political and military dignitaries. Each tombstone is wrought with symbolism and makes for a very interesting and worthwhile visit.

Your next stop today will be Moscow's Museum of Cosmonautics, a rarely visited museum that brings to life the history of Soviet and Russian space exploration. The museum is located at the base of the impressive (and famous) Monument to the Conquerors of Space, which is some 350 feet high and covered with titanium. You can also see Cosmonaut Alley, which is lined with busts of cosmonauts, space scientists, and rocket engineers including Yuri Gagarin - the first man to fly into space, and Valentina Tereshkova - the first woman to fly into space. The Space Museum re-opened in 2009 after years of renovation and expansion and now houses an expanse of authentic exhibits focusing on the different stages of space exploration. You won't want to miss the collection of space suits which shows how they were developed and improved through the years, the small capsule in which Gagarin flew into space, and the models of space stations - some of which one can actually walk through. There is also a café in the lobby area where 'space food' is available for purchase!

## DAY THREE

June 22, 2012 | Friday

**Moscow**

Today, your guide will take you into the Kremlin and through its expansive grounds. Here you will see the largest bell in the world – as well as the largest canon. Neither was ever used due to their enormous size! Also on the grounds of the Kremlin are three very important churches and your guide will take you through all that are of interest. We suggest you don't miss the Assumption Cathedral, where all Russian tsars were crowned.

Later, your guide will take you to the famed Armory Museum, including its vast collection of Imperial Russian artwork. You will have the opportunity to see the Kremlin's unique and intimate collection of Imperial Faberge Easter Eggs. Also in the Armory are many of the most important Imperial thrones and crowns, including the most historic, Cap of Monomachus.

Included in your Kremlin visit today is a private entry into the Diamond Vaults. You will see Catherine the Great's scepter with its famous Orlov Diamond and one of the largest collections of diamonds and gem stones in the world! Your guide will provide you with a detailed history behind these jewels and obtain an insight into Russia's imperial history.

A light lunch will be included today near the Kremlin.



#### EXETER INTERNATIONAL EXTRAORDINARY EXPERIENCE

This afternoon you will be among the few ever allowed into the Grand Kremlin Palace to see the Grand Kremlin Palace proper, the Faceted Chamber, and the Terem. The ancient Terem was home to the very earliest tsars and was the official residence of the Romanovs. The Faceted Chamber, the oldest building in the complex, was constructed in the fifteenth century by the order of Ivan the Terrible. Today, these palaces have been completely renovated at the cost of over \$300 million dollars in the 1990's and are now used by the Russian President for entertaining and hosting State visits and meetings. Some of the rooms, including the Romanov's Throne Hall and St. Alexander's Room are unique in the world. Please note that special permission and security clearance is required for this visit. Your passport details will need to be sent to Kremlin authorities at least one month prior to your visit. This excursion cannot be moved to another time once it is confirmed.

Special note: All touring today is on foot. Please wear comfortable shoes.

## DAY FOUR

June 23, 2012 | Saturday  
Moscow-St. Petersburg

Morning at leisure in Moscow. Later, transfer to the rail station for embarkation on the Sapsan high-speed rail service to St. Petersburg, Russia's new bullet train offering the most luxurious and convenient way to travel between the cities (3 hours and 40 minutes). Business class seats have been reserved for you and lunch will be served on board.

Transfer upon arrival to the Taleon Imperial Hotel located on Nevsky Prospect and within a short walk to Palace Square and the Hermitage.

Evening at leisure in St. Petersburg. Please contact Exeter International if you are interested in attending a performance at the Mariinsky (Kirov) Theater this evening for opera, ballet or symphony (not included in the program).

## DAY FIVE

June 24, 2012 | Sunday

### St. Petersburg

Morning departure into the Russian countryside to see two of the city's most elegant and beautiful palaces- Catherine Palace (formerly Pushkin) and Pavlovsk, in the nearby village of the same name.

Your first stop will be Pavlovsk Palace, built by Paul I and his wife Maria. This is the understated summer palace of the tsars. Started by Catherine the Great's favorite architect, Cameron (a Scot), the palace was later finished by Paul's and his wife Maria's preferred architect, Andrei Voronykhin- a Russian serf who later became one of the greatest architects ever to work in Russia. (For those interested in Russian history, with a focus on architecture and design, you won't want to miss reading Suzanne Massie's Pavlovsk: the Life of a Russian Palace.)

You will have lunch today at the restaurant, Podvorye. This charming restaurant is made of wood and features lively folk entertainment at lunch. Lunch consists of 2 courses, vodka, wine, mineral water, and coffee or tea.

Afterwards, you will visit the lavish Catherine Palace and its fabled Amber Room. This palace was originally designed in the 1750s in the Rococo style by the famous architect Rastrelli (who also designed many of St. Petersburg's grandest buildings like the Winter Palace, parts of Peterhof, the Stroganoff Palace, and the Smolny Cathedral) for the Tsarina (Princess) Elizabeth, who named it after her mother Catherine I – Peter the Great's second wife. Later, Catherine II (the Great) commissioned the Scottish architect Charles Cameron to re-design the palace's interiors in the then-fashionable Neo-Classical style. After Catherine the Great's death, the palace remained largely unchanged for centuries until the Second World War when the Nazi army, retreating after the unsuccessful siege of Leningrad, destroyed the palace almost completely. After the war, the magnificent palace and its interiors were thoroughly and painstakingly rebuilt, but renovations at some parts still continue.

## DAY SIX

June 25, 2012 | Monday

### St. Petersburg

Check out of your hotel this morning (your luggage will be transferred directly to the Silver Whisper) and meet your guide in the lobby at 10:00am.

Today you will be among the few ever to be allowed into the Hermitage and Winter Palace on a Monday, when it is closed to the public. You will be able to enjoy the collection without the usual summer crowds for a truly extraordinary experience.

**The Hermitage museum is closed on Mondays and special arrangements have been made to open the museum especially for you for a private tour.**

This afternoon lunch will be served in a local restaurant (two courses and unlimited mineral water, tea or coffee).

Later you will visit Peter Paul Fortress: the birthplace of St. Petersburg. After walking through the many gates and across the bridges and moats, you can begin to feel the late 18th century era that required such fortification. As Peter's original outpost against the Swedes, St. Petersburg was born from this fortress and its historical significance is felt to this day by the presence of every Romanov tomb from Peter the Great.

Finally today, your guide will take you into the stately St. Isaac's Cathedral. Its malachite and lapis lazuli columns are not to be missed! St. Isaac's was built between 1818 and 1858 by the French-born architect Auguste Montferrand to be one of the most impressive landmarks of the Russian Imperial capital. During World War II, the golden dome was painted gray to avoid its being targeted by Nazi fire. For those with strong legs, you can climb to the top of the Cathedral's dome for the finest views over St. Petersburg's historic neighborhood.

Late afternoon transfer to the Silver Whisper for embarkation. Evening onboard.

## DAY SEVEN

June 26, 2012 | Tuesday

St. Petersburg

This morning your guide will meet you at 9:00AM to take you on another very unusual excursion- to Peter the Great's summer palace, Peterhof, **on a day that it is closed to the general public. You will be among the few ever to enjoy this world famous palace without the usual summer crowds.**

Peterhof Palace (or Petrodvorets in Russian) is often called the Russian Versailles due to the prominence of the gardens and fountains. The view from the palace through the grand colonnade of fountains to the Baltic Sea is one of the true masterpieces of Russian artistry. There are many parts to the palace complex and to view them all, you will need to devote most of the day.

When you walk through the upper gardens, you can enter the Grand Palace of Peterhof. This stately palace overlooks the gardens and smaller palaces, as well as the Baltic Sea. The ornate baroque interiors of the Grand Palace will no doubt amaze you and no one soon forgets the unique Chinese Room filled with lacquer and ancient silk.

Later you may want to visit the Grottos of Peterhof. The tremendous variety of fountains is one of the principal features of Peterhof, where their extravagance and playfulness indicate the atmosphere of early 18th century Russia. You will journey underneath the fountains and learn of their remarkable engineering and history.

As you move towards the lower gardens you will be able to see Peter the Great's favorite buildings. It is also in this area that you will see Peterhof's most enchanting treat - the trick fountains of the gardens. Be careful where you step in this area - you could be hit by a surprise stream of water as you stroll!

Lunch today is in the historic Orangery of Peterhof Palace opposite the famous Triton fountain. The grandfather of the modern greenhouse, this Orangery served as the palace's main garden center and was used as a freeze shelter for the garden's many orange, apple, and other fruit trees during the harsh St. Petersburg winters. Although the café located inside the historic building is not a fine dining restaurant, the buffet style restaurant offers hot soups, rolls, salads and other light cuisine. Cost of lunch today is included in the tour.

If the weather is nice, a special treat is to take the express hydrofoil from Peterhof back to the city. The one-hour ride takes you out of the city traffic and into the Baltic Sea! Your guide will go with you on the hydrofoil.

Return to your ship by 4:00PM for the 6:00PM departure for Helsinki.
